Our season 2019/2020 trophy presentation night had to be cancelled but we were able to get trophies to all those that received awards by asking clubs to collect the trophies from our Brendale store or they were delivered direct to clubs. However, onto to more pleasant things to write about. Our season of 2019 / 2020 provided our young cricketers for an opportunity to enjoy their cricket with their friends and show their skills over the season.

Our internal trial competitions were again successful with this season seeing the introduction of the Under 12 Casey Cup which was won by team Netto coached by Luke Joel and captained by Steven Hogan. This competition was very well received by all as it gave the boys the opportunity to pit their skills against the best of their peers in the age group. Our Under 13 Reevesie Cup was won by the Hurricanes, coached by Jack Sweeney and captained by Jayden Draper while our Under 14 Anstey / La Frantz competition was won by the Redbacks, coached by Tom Hadden and captained by Kane Neilsen.

We had quite a few successes in the Representative programs during the 2019 – 2020 Christmas period. Two of our teams won the QC State Challenge and they were, Under 14s coached by Bryan Hadden and captained by Jack Balkin and our Under 15s coached by Col Wade and captained by Hugh Weibgen. Our Under 13 Development team coached by Richard Clay won the Ipswich organised Les Kinnane memorial Shield and in a nail-biting finish that went down to the last ball of the competition on the last day, our Under 14 Blue Development team won the Sunshine Coast Carnival. They were coached by Tom Hadden and captained by Billy Nuss. Our Under 15 Girls City Fever team coached by Tony Dudgeon and our U13 Girls City Fever team both won their Carnivals.

Our girls cricket competition is still expanding due to the driving force of our Robert Bailey who again was instrumental in getting the CaSSSA (Catholic Secondary School Sports Association) competition up and running. This competition launched in 2019 featuring eight schools won the Celebrating Cricket in Schools category for both Queensland Cricket and the Australian Cricket awards.

At long last we have received the keys to the Council renovated building at Bertha Street the Kalinga Park complex. Plans are now in place to kit the building out so it can be used by our Association during the cricket season. We are very fortunate that the building caters for both Female and Male participants. A huge boost to our girl's competitions.

We are very fortunate to have a very active and knowledgeable group of members on our Management Committee who have the community view of what is best for our client base. Thank you to each and every one of you. To Sam Harris from Queensland Cricket, Aaron Mills our Male Coaching Coordinator and Tony Dudgeon our Female Coaching Director, thank you to you all.

While I am into thank you 's there are many that need to be acknowledge as their contributions are so vital to the successful operation of the Association and those persons are the people who run the affiliated clubs along with their parent base. Also, congratulations to Mick Patton from Burpengary Brumbies who was awarded the BNCA Volunteer of the Year Award on the success of his endeavours and organisation in getting the Club back on its feet and signing on players after some sad happenings to their incumbent President.

Our Patron Keith Dudgeon stood down after some years and Michael Skinner accepted our nomination and was duly elected as our new Patron. Again, we thank Keith and his KD company for their ongoing support and generous contribution to the Association through sponsorship.

The highest honour that can be bestowed upon a member or supporter of an organisation is that of Life Membership. Huge congratulations to Kathy Casey from Albany Creek Cricket Club on being elected a Life Member. Many thanks to Kathy who has spent many years, 15 to be exact, along with her husband Steve coordinating and running the Ian Healy Cup. The other fact that is exciting is that Kathy is our first female life member. A very deserving award.

Draw Committee 2019-20 report



Clubs affiliated with BN dropped from 14 to 13 this year, with Marist College Ashgrove not entering any teams. Unfortunately, in addition, the Pine Rivers Junior club were unable to field any junior teams again this year, however they did form six Blaster teams so we hope that the club will be back with older age teams next season.


We had an increase in team numbers from 350 last year to 375 this year. The team number increase was mainly attributable to Blaster teams again increasing from 103 to 116. There was also a flow-on effect from the previous season with U10 increasing by 6 teams and U13 increasing by 8 from 28 to 36 teams.

The second year of the new format cricket in u10/11 again allowed us to organise 2 games on an oval in the morning by starting these games a little bit earlier and easing the pressure of oval availability. Post-Xmas, after listening to concerns raised by clubs, we changed the starting time of U11 to the 7.15am time slot and U10 to the later one. This meant the experienced U11 teams finished their games within the time allowed and the U10, new to this form of cricket, could take longer to adjust and games could go a little over the designated time.

We also altered our U12 draws into 2 distinct formats: **Pathway Cricket** – Game played over 2 days, as per the previous year and operating off 18m pitch length and rules as per U12 Championships. **Junior Format cricket**: This alternative format would be **one day games**, using an 18m pitch, 3 hours long, 9 players to a team, and using Cricket Australia Stage 2 rules. Clubs nominated what form of cricket each of their teams were to play. We ended up with 13 teams in Junior Format and 26 teams playing Pathway format.

We moved into our third full year of all-girls competitions with an increase of 3 teams to 23 teams participating in Pre-Xmas & 21 in Post-Xmas competitions. Once again this was the result of a lot of hard work by Robert Bailey at BNJCA. We strongly encourage clubs to organise their female teams and actively promote this form of cricket.

We lost our first game of the season to rain on Saturday 12 October 2019 and a number of games were washed out at various locations in late October. We also had to contend with extreme heat on Saturday 7 December. Moving on to Post Xmas games and more rain meant we had to cancel all cricket on 8 February and again on 15 February and many games were lost on 7 March. We then had all games cancelled by Cricket Australia on 21 March due the COVID-19 virus.



Thank you to the many state schools who allowed us to use their grounds during the season. I would also like to express our appreciation for the continuing support from the Brisbane City Council, Moreton Bay Regional Council, the Warehouse Cricket Association, District Cricket Clubs north of the river and a number of private schools who all make ovals available for us to use. BNJCA could not operate such a large competition without their assistance.

Finally, thanks to Steve Casey, Laurie Hallam and Robert Bailey for their Draw assistance, Richard Clay for organising school ground approvals this year, Geoff Cowles for his input and drafting of the Rules and Ian Rushton for MyCricket support.

Treasurer's 2019-20 report

We have continued to be prudent by trying to plan for things like changing Super 6, ground costs, expansion of girl's cricket and the on-going Kalinga Park base.

We have been given the keys to the Bertha St building at Kalinga Park, however we have to get quotations done and then the internal fit out completed. Currently this is being delayed due to the Covid-19 concerns and until we can get contractors to quote and then to do the work, this activity is on hold. We also hope to get some work paid for with the assistance of various grants, so more delays are expected due to this. The change to amalgamate Super 6 and Blaster formats was only

able to be done with the assistance of grants from Queensland Cricket as we would have lost thousands of dollars in revenue.

With all this happening over the year, we have still been able to promote the game more and expand at the same time, recording a surplus of \$23,344. Net assets last year were \$304,026, this year that has grown to \$327,381. This puts us in a strong position to overcome issues that our clubs face next season that are associated with what will happen with junior cricket due to Government Covid-19 requirements and school oval costs as they arise.

Grants Committee 2019-20 report



Each year BNJCA provides grants to affiliated clubs, to assist in bringing new fields into use and ensuring that grounds that are used by the BNJCA, are kept in a safe and useable condition. We approve grants for repairs and new pitch installations but do not approve grants for practice nets as these are not required to play cricket on Saturday mornings. The Grants Policy and application form are available for downloading from the website www.bnjca.qld.cricket.com.au

Grants approved this year totalled **\$19,375**. The following subsidies were provided to clubs in 2019-20:



We paid out extra funds this year as a result of the initiative by Queensland Cricket to get new pitches into schools that had none on their oval or had unplayable pitches due to age, cracking or subsidence. Queensland Cricket were paying 1/3 of the cost, with the school paying 1/3 and BNJCA paying 1/3. Clubs did not have to contribute under this program. As a consequence, BNJCA Management Committee approved spending over our allotted annual grant maximum of \$12,000, to ensure we got as many new pitches done and as much subsidy as possible from Queensland Cricket.

Player Fees & Club Affiliation fees 2019-20




The player fees structure and affiliation fee amount for the 2019-20 season was kept the same again and this has not increased for the past 8 years. The Saturday player fee was set at \$25 and the Blaster fee was paid when the player signed on with Cricket Australia for Junior or Master Blaster. The annual BNJCA club affiliation fee was again set at \$1 per club.

All BNJCA equipment, records and trophies continue to be stored securely in our South Pine Brendale premises providing easier access and distribution throughout the year.

Once again, we acknowledge and appreciate the support of Keith Dudgeon Sports, Emu Sportswear and Starline Promotions for supplying the Representative caps, kit bags, back packs and uniforms and Extreme Marquees for donating a shade tent.

Rivers, Norths and Everton grounds for Reevesie and ALF competitions is also appreciated.

We encourage clubs to actively check ovals and greenspace in their area to see if any potential new playing areas can be utilized. If some ovals are currently unable to be used because of their playing surface, please contact Paul Levens at Qld Cricket and talk about what can be done to get them operational again, this includes any schools or parks.

Director of Girl's Cricket 2019-20 report

Season 2019-20 represents the 4th year of Brisbane North Junior Cricket Associations (BNJCA) Girls Cricket program. Significantly it brings us to the half way point the of the '1 in 3 by 2023' project. To date we have established a clear pathway for girls to engage in all girls' competitions from junior all the way to senior cricket. This growth has fuelled the growth of the Women's Premier Grade Competition with girls moving away from BNJCA to seek senior cricket opportunities across Brisbane. Impressively the BNJCA Girls Competition has continued to grow despite this attrition with similar success also being enjoyed at a representative level. Significantly, season 2019-20 appears to have proven to be a 'watershed' year in the

growth of Girls Cricket in BNJCA with the need to a revision of the promotion and demographics of strategy a priority for next season to ensure that the program does not stagnate.

Girls Cricket Competition

The Girls Cricket Competition has continued to grow from strength to strength with 10 teams competing in the u11 draw along with 8 in u13's and 6 in u15's. The growth in the u11 draw has been particularly impressive as this indicates that girls are engaging with cricket even after the tremendous early momentum that the '1 in 3 by 2023' campaign created.

Master Blaster (Formerly Super 6's)

Super 6's cricket integrated with Master Blaster to provide a single pathway for Juniors who want to start playing cricket. These programs showed continued growth which is important as they are critical to the sustainability of the Girls Cricket programs as they are the nurseries that will fuel the Girls Cricket Competition and Senior pathways.

Girls 'Come & Play' and 'January Camps'

The Girls 'Come & Play' and 'January Camps' took place all be it with reduced numbers than previously and while the feedback from participants was outstanding it appears that the concept is in need of a refresh.

Building Cultural Depth

After considerable time and focus, the Catholic Secondary School Sports Association (CaSSSA) held its first CaSSSA Cup which took place in October, featuring players from 12 schools. In total 8 teams played in 2 pools with the eventual finals being played under lights in what was a highly successful day of cricket. Importantly the School Sports Co-ordinators were highly impressed with the day and plans have already been made for the 2020 competition. The timing of the CaSSSA 2020 competition will be made to allow schools to have 6 weeks preparation time to select and train before deciding CaSSSA Cricket supremacy on the day.

Winter Warehouse

Preparation for the 2020 Winter Warehouse was looking extremely promising with stand-alone u13 and u16 Girls Competitions looking firm and even more excitingly a 4 team Women's Cricket Competition looking on the cards. Unfortunately, as I write this report the COVID-19 pandemic has had a highly detrimental impact on the winter competition and we await to see what opportunities are possible in the latter half of the winter season.

Future Directions

While BNJCA's Girls Cricket program is the benchmark for Association's to follow Nationally, there is still considerably work to do to fulfil the games potential in female participation. The female participation space is highly competitive and if BNJCA is to maintain momentum a review of the strategy is necessary to remain ahead of the curve and continue to set the standard in building female participation.

Based on this theme the following priorities have been targeted for season 2020-21:

The absolute priority for season 2020-21 is the creation of all Girls Master Blaster programs to feed the exiting Girls pathways. Ideally these programmes should take place in the evenings and be integrated into the program that replaces the Girls 'Come & Play' and 'January Camps'.

There is a need to create an alternative pathway for female participation for girls to continue to play the game without the intense approach that Premier Club's employ in preparation for the Women's Premier Cricket Competitions. This is particularly important as many girls are simply not interested in Senior Women's cricket at a Premier Cricket level and ultimately leave the game as we cannot provide an option. This competition should be created as a project engaging QSDCA, Warehouse and Junior Associations as opposed to Premier clubs. Ultimately, we should strive to make cricket a game that girls can continue to play and engage with throughout their lives.

The creation of a 3rd Senior Women's program at a Premier Club is essential to provide opportunities for girls seeking a competitive option within the catchment of BNJCA. This is important not only to prevent the current drain of players away from BNJCA but to provide access to improved infrastructure that can assist the growth of Girls Cricket.

The Girls 'Come & Play' and 'January Camps' while highly successful appear to have served their purpose and a refreshed strategy is needed to continue growing girls' cricket. Currently discussions are being held with Queensland Cricket to develop a program that engages all Junior programs to create a single initiative focusing the entire cricket community on a single promotional strategy for growing female participation.

The impact of COVID-19 in 2020 has had far ranging implications for winter sport, however, I would suggest that it represents a significant opportunity for cricket to capitalise on a sport starved nation when preparations for our season begin in late winter.

BRISBANE NORTH JUNIOR CRICKET ASSOCIATION INC. NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2020

The financial statements cover Brisbane North Junior Cricket Association as an individual entity. Brisbane North Junior Cricket Association is a not-for-profit Association incorporated in Queensland under the Associations Incorporation Act (QLD) 1981 (as amended by the Associations Incorporation and Other Legislation Amendment Act (QLD) 2007) ('the Act').

The principal activities of the Association for the year ended 30 June 2020 were the administration of junior cricket in the north Brisbane region.

The functional and presentation currency of Brisbane North Junior Cricket Association is Australian dollars Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1. Basis of Preparation

In the opinion of the Committee of Management, the Association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial report who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Income Tax

The Association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(b) Leases

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all of the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses on a straight-line basis over the life of the lease term.

(c) Revenue and other income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Sale of goods

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when risks and rewards are transferred and there is no longer any ownership or effective control over the goods.

Donations

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

Other Income

Other income is recognised on an accruals basis when the Association is entitled to it

(d) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of assets and liabilities are shown inclusive of GST

(e) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first-in-first-out basis and is net of any rebates and discounts received

(f) Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment of losses.

Items of property, plant and equipment acquired for nil or nominal consideration have been recorded at the acquisition date fair value.

Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land are depreciated on a reducing balance basis over the assets useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

Leased assets and leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter or either the unexpired period of the lease or their estimated useful life.

(g) Cash and cash equivalents

Cricket is a game that owes much of its unique appeal to the fact that it should be played not only within its Laws but also within the Spirit of the Game. Any action which is seen to abuse this spirit causes injury to the game itself. The Spirit of the Game involves respect for:

- Your opponents
- Your own captain and team
- The role of the umpires
- The game's traditional values

The BNJCA supports the Spirit of Cricket, as embodied in the preamble to the Laws of Cricket, in a tangible way, with a Spirit of Cricket Award. The Association accepts nominations from clubs for a player displaying the true spirit, traditions, and values of cricket. The player must be playing in a BNJCA competition. This award does not apply to adults.

In order for a club to nominate a player, the action must be at the player's instigation, not a result of an adult's intervention. The nomination can come from anyone involved in the game; other players, umpire, coach or spectators, but must be made through the affiliated club of the nominating person.







New Bertha Street building at Kalinga Park


